

APPLICATION FOR THE REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE LICENSING ACT 2003

NOTICE is hereby given that Stafford Borough Council has on the 31 August 2017 received an application for the review of the premises licence in respect of the premises know as Shimla Palace, Cromwell House, Wolsley Bridge, Stafford ST17 0XS

The grounds for the review application relate to the licensing objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety and are stated as follows: –

Staffordshire Police have significant concerns around Mr MUKTADIR's commitment to work within objectives of the Licensing Act 2003.

As a result of two search warrants executed by the Immigration Service, at premises under the control of Mr MUKTADIR, illegal workers were found at both premises. Three illegal workers were found to be in employment at the Shimla Palace restaurant on the 5th October 2016. When Mr MUKTADIR was interviewed he clearly demonstrated a lack of due diligence in relation to the employment of the three males.

It is an offence to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with an application. The maximum fine, for which a person is liable on summary conviction for the offence, is level 5 on the standard scale, currently £5,000.
